A Follow Up to our Conference Keynote Speaker... Holly van Gulden



Check out Holly van Gulden's and Charlotte Vick's book, Learning the Dance of Attachment, An Adoptive/Foster Parent's Guide to Nurturing Healthy Development. "This is a child development guide specifically written for adoptive and foster parents. It explains the normal stages of childhood emotional development and contrasts it with dysfunctional behaviors caused by early life deprivation and abuse. This book is helpful as a training tool for potential foster and adoptive parents. Parents already facing frustrating and unexplained behaviors can read this guide to understand the causes of their child's misbehavior and learn techniques to overcome problems. Child welfare professionals should use The Dance of Attachment as a support tool for clients and families."

Adoption Tax Credit

Adoptive families can offset their adoption costs by utilizing the Federal Adoption Tax Credit, which is non-refundable. For 2013, the maximum adoption tax credit is \$12,970, for all qualifying adoption expenses, and is non-refundable.

In January 2013, the Federal Adoption Tax Credit was made permanent. The adoption credit is not refundable, which means that only those individuals with tax liability (taxes owed) will benefit. The credit will remain flat for special needs adoptions (those involving children who are deemed hard to place by a child welfare agency), allowing those families to claim the maximum credit regardless of expenses. New Jersey's 32nd "Let's Talk Adoption" Conference held on November 9, 2013

The year 2013 was one to be remembered for many reasons, one of which was that CPFA ran two full-day conferences, one on January 13 (postponed from 2012 due to Sandy) and one on November 9, 2013. Amazingly, attendance was robust at both events with three hundred eighteen people in attendance at the fall conference.

Holly van Gulden's keynote address "To Have and To Hold: Learning the Dance of Attachment" was profound and set the tenor for a day of 36 informative workshops given by 47 speakers and panelists. Many speakers were new to our conference and we hope to see them again. There were workshops for everyone – adult adoptees, foster parents, adoptive parents (prospective and seasoned), birth parents, social workers and counselors, educators, and students.

A special lunchtime discussion about "Re-Homing", the horrific new phenomena where adoptive parents have 'advertised' their child on the internet and relinquished them (informally) to strangers who answered their ad, was led by panelists Alla Gordina, MD, IBCLC, FAAP; Rita Taddonio, LCSW; Lorraine Kolankowski, LCSW; Karen Simmons and Sarah McCarthy (The Children's Law Center), and moderated by Pat Bennett. Ways to move forward and tackle this reprehensible issue, including better education for adoptive parents, were discussed.

We extend our gratitude to the seven special exhibitors, the fourteen New Jersey licensed Agency exhibitors, and the Wachung Booksellers for providing attendees with valuable information and resources! We also thank Gina Sharpe LCSW and Pam Simone from Rutgers University School of Social Work, Institute for Families who co-sponsor the conference and are responsible for the CEH program; Lorraine Kolankowski from NJ Interagency Adoption Council; Dan Turano and his staff from the Busch Campus Center for logistical and technical support; and Gerlanda's for breakfast and beverages!
