- Explore all options in a safe, non-coercive environment
- Be fully informed about your legal rights related to parenting or adoptive planning
- Have your questions answered honestly and completely
- Include family and friends in any meeting, if desired

In New Jersey, your rights related to adoption plans include:

- Choosing a prospective adoptive family, if you want to
- Be informed of the process adoptive families go through prior to approval
- Developing a personalized adoption plan that includes decisions about ongoing communication and contact
- Ability to give signed consent before any social, medical, or mental health information is shared with prospective adoptive families
- Receiving copies of all adoption-related documents that you need to sign and have them provided or explained in your preferred language
- Spending as much, or as little, time in the hospital with your baby as you want
- Receiving information about the post-placement services and support available to you
- Appointing a guardian to represent your interests if you're under the age of 19
- Signing adoption relinquishment documents prior to birth or any time after birth

Additional information to keep in mind:

- Biological grandparents have no legal authority to parent a newborn
- If involved, fathers may sign adoption relinquishment documents any time prior to birth or when you sign
- There is a five-day revocation period in Alabama, so you may withdraw your relinquishment within five days after birth or within five days after signing relinquishment—whichever comes last
