-Stimulants (Cocaine, Methamphetamine, Amphetamine, Ritalin, Adderall, Concerta, Ecstacy, Molly, MDMA)
-Opiates (Heroine, Codeine, Methadone, Subutex, Suboxone, Vicodin, Percocet, Oxycodone, Dilaudid, Fentanyl)
Infection -HIV
-Hepatitis B
-Hepatitis C
Mental Health Issues -Depression with/without medications
-Anxiety with/ without medications
-Bipolar (severe mood swings) with/ without medications
-Schizophrenia with/without medications
Maternal Social Issues -Sexually Assaulted
